

Criteria considered during review process

Here is some of the criteria that we anticipate will be considered by the community panel:

- Is the proposal complete?
- Does the proposer have a connection to Red Hook?
- Will this project address a need/concern/strength of Red Hook community members? Does this project have a strong potential impact?
- Does the proposal demonstrate a sensitivity to existing ecosystem, communities, and organizers already working and living in Red Hook? Will this project strengthen or deepen community organizing currently happening or starting to happen in Red Hook?
- Is the project realistic?
- Is the budget realistic? Do the resources that the proposer requires match what RHCJC has to offer?
- Has the proposer articulated how they will be inclusive?
- Has the proposer articulated about how they will attempt balance multiple forms of inequity?
- Is the project plan clear, reasonable, well thought out?
- Is the project innovative? Exciting?
- Does this project align with our goals and values? Is it *inclusive, community-driven, include elements of joy?*)
- Will this sketch of this project be able to enhance efforts of the Red Hook Community Justice Center and/or partner with Red Hook Community Justice Center?
